Treasurer's Corner NMRA Finances

Introduction. I was first introduced to the *NMRA* by a friend at the *2006 Canoga Park tournament*. I have been a sponsored player with *Ektelon* for awhile through *World Outdoor Racquetball*.

In 2006, after viewing <u>www.nmra.info</u> and seeing that the Treasurer's position was vacant, I volunteered to assist in the bookkeeping requirements for the *NMRA*. The current board met with me during the Portland tournament and, at a special meeting after the banquet, voted me in as Treasurer.

Currently the Chief Financial Officer for an apparel company located in Los Angeles, CA, I have over 30 years experience in the accounting field. Since becoming the *NMRA Treasurer*, I spearheaded the effort to use the *R2Sports tournament software* used to run the *Kansas 2007* event allowing the use of credit card processing for the convenience of our players.

General Financial Report. The *NMRA*'s current financial picture is strong. We have approximately \$29,000.00 in the general fund to support future operations and contributions. This amount assures the *NMRA* of its ability to cover all contingent liabilities if a tournament had to be cancelled for any reason. During 2007, the *NMRA* made contributions totaling \$4,500 supporting various Junior Racquetball events, and has committed \$1,000 to support the *Junior USA Teams* trip to Bolivia in December.

Our next major project is to update and automate the membership database using the *R2Sports* server and add email capabilities to reach our members. Before we start the cutover in a few months, <u>please update your personal information</u>, email address, street address and telephone numbers (including cell phone, if applicable). UTAH Here We Come!

Historically, our *March National Tournaments* have been held west of the Mississippi River. We are happy to keep with that tradition and provide specific information on the upcoming event in Provo/Orem UT. All of the information in this article is also available on the *Official NMRA Website:* <u>www.nmra.info</u>. Just click on the *'Tournament'* page.

We will start the event with registration from 5 pm until 8 pm at the host hotel, the *Marriott Hotel Conference Center* in Provo, UT. You can contact the hotel via phone for reservations at: 1-801-377-4700 and ask for the special *NMRA Rate.* You can also register at the hotel by going to a special website they have set up just for the *NMRA.* That website address is: https://resweb.passkey.com/Resweb.do?mode=welcome_gi_new&groupID=110038

The per-night room rate for our event is \$89 plus tax. In addition to registration on Tuesday night, March 4, 2008, the hotel will be the location for each of the NMRA evening hospitality setups (Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday). It will also be the location for the Tournament Banquet on Friday night, March 7, 2008.

The reason we are holding all of our 'events' at the hotel is because the clubs are located on either City or College property and thereby cannot permit offering alcohol. Since the hotel is going to be the central location for everything except our matches, we strongly recommend that you make your reservation at the host hotel and do it NOW.

We have set aside 90 rooms for the event. We cannot guarantee that any other rooms will be available at the NMRA rate as of February 1; however, the hotel has agreed to increase those rooms ONLY if we fill the original block within 30 days of the event. For your travel and planning purposes here is the address for the hotel:

Provo Marriott Hotel & Conference Center /101 West 100 North , Provo, UT 84601 The host hotel will be offering regular shuttle service to and from the hotel and each of the two clubs. This is another great and practical reason for staying at the host hotel. No other shuttle service will be provided.

The hotel does not have a shuttle from the airport. Here are the numbers for shuttle services to and from the airport and hotel:

Medallion (hotel preferred) — 801.364.8788 \$85 total for up to four people *American Taxi* — 801.427.9448 \$65 per person *Express Shuttle* — 801.596.1600 \$30 per person and \$14 for each additional person in the same party.

For matches, we have contracted with the *Orem Fitness Center* and *Utah Valley State College*. Both are located in Orem, UT and are less than 4 miles apart and from the host hotel. The Orem Fitness

Center has 12 courts and UVSC has 8. Lunch will be catered at both locations daily by the UVSC Catering Service to each of the facilities.

We had a great time at the *National Championship Tournament* in Overland Park, Kansas, last Julyexcellent clubs, hotel, and hospitality, not to mention the Banquet. That event also marked our first event administered by the *R2Sports Tournament Software* program. It provided us a way to streamline our registration time and have a single, direct management of all funds to our Treasurer. In July, over 30% of the players registered online. I'm hoping to see an even higher percentage of players entering the March 2008 *National Championships* in Orem, Utah.

Many of you are old hats at using the R2 system. It is the *Official Tournament Management System* for the *USAR*. Players who participate in the *US Open, National Singles* and *Doubles*, and *Pro Stops* know that R2 has set the standard. The *NMRA* contracted with **Ryan Rogers** (ah...R2), the owner, to upgrade his program to better serve the needs of our tournament format. The changes worked exceptionally well in Kansas, and when they did not, Ryan fixed the problems immediately. Ryan is now working with **Dick Lowell**, our *Webmaster* for the *NMRA Official Website* (www.nmra.info) for upgrades to the site that will include email capability with all of our members.

He also worked with Merijean Kelly, NMRA Membership Coordinator, to have the NMRA Membership data base updated automatically during our tournament entry and registration.

With all of this talk about websites, and upgrades, it is important to remember how we got here. If it was not for the dedication and actions of Jim Emerson, we would not be involved with the technology the way we are today. Long before it was 'cool,' Jim provided a website to the NMRA. His development and design of the NMRA page on www.myfamily.com introduced all of us to the usefulness of the internet. We all owe a great debt of gratitude to Jim for his vision and service to the NMRA.

Over the past year, the NMRA Board of Directors has approved providing funding support to Juniors and Womens Programs in the name of the NMRA. We felt this is the most direct way to ensure the future of our sport. The NMRA enjoyed recognition for its service and support to these groups during the banquet at National Singles. The presentation included announcements that the NMRA was the Event Sponsor for the 2007 Junior Elite Training Camp.

In addition to the Junior Camp donation, the NMRA, at the Junior Championship Tournament held in Tempe, Arizona this year, provided a donation that sponsored an evening hospitality for all of the junior participants. If you played in Kansas, you saw the court decals from the Junior Association thanking the NMRA.

In our continued support of the junior programs, the NMRA has partnered with the Classic Tour and is matching the tour's donation to juniors at each of their stops (up to \$300 per stop). This is an excellent way to achieve our support goal for the juniors while getting some National Recognition as well.

In the area of Womens programs support, two members of the NMRA, who want to remain anonymous, donated \$1,500 to the Women's Association at their annual 'Ladies Night' Event at National Singles in Houston. The donation was the amount the women had hoped to raise from a special painting donated by Pro Player, Artist, and NMRA Member, Ruben Gonzales, to the Women's Association to be auctioned off during at the event in Houston. With the \$1,500 seed money donated at the kick-off meeting, the auction raised well over \$5,000 during the remainder of the year.

The NMRA also funded the changes in the R2 software program now used by the Women Senior / Master Association as a show of our support to Women Players.

I hope to see you in Provo, UT... and, make sure you stay at the host hotel this year. Tuesday Night Registration and all evening hospitality will be held at the Marriott, Provo Convention and Conference *Center* (the Friday night Banquet too). We are doing this since we will be playing at a college and city-owned recreation center--neither of which will permit alcohol. The tournament website is up and ready for your online (or mail) entry. Editor's Corner Fun With Fitness

If you love racquetball, you know that fitness can be a blast. This article is for people who play all the time, but it is especially for those who don't.

I had thought about this for a long time and knew it would be a good idea, but hadn't tried it until the beginning of the summer. I was not getting in enough racquetball or cardio workout time, but I wondered really how much exercise I was getting. I went to Target and bought an \$8.00 pedometer/clock, and I am so glad I did!

The standard exercise goal for an adult is to get in 10,000 steps each day. That number roughly equates to five miles of walking, but walking isn't the only way to get in your steps, of course. Jogging, dancing, jumping rope, and working out on a machine are all great ways to get in your steps. They all take a little longer than playing racquetball, of course. I found that about 90 minutes of singles or two hours of doubles can easily rack up 10,000 steps, and you get more steps throughout the rest of the day.

When I think about watching TV at the end of the day, I look at my pedometer to see if I can relax. If I need a few more steps to reach my goal, I jog in place until I have 10,000. If I have done over 15,000 steps in a day, I feel I can have a dessert. It's not only useful for helping me gauge my level of activity toward my daily goal, but it's also pretty fun. My pedometer lets me know if I've gotten a decent workout-even on the days I haven't played racquetball.

Try a pedometer for yourself, and give one as a gift. Keep track of your steps and compare numbers at the end of the month. Maybe even make a friendly wager. Happy stepping!

NMRA 2007 International Championships

The 2007 National Masters Racquetball Association's (NMRA) International Championships were held July 25 through 28, 2007 at the beautiful Athletic Club of Overland Park, Kansas. The facility has nine courts on three levels; a full-service Pro Shop; spacious locker rooms; full-service bar with viewing of two courts with full back glass wall. There is also a sister club, the Fox Hill Club, about two miles away with six courts. Both venues handled 192 participants in singles, doubles, and mixed doubles. There were 24 divisions from 45 years young to 90+ years younger, with 14 divisions in doubles. Additionally, there were about 50 first-time NMRA players in the tournament.

There was the usual celebratory banquet, but this year, the theme was based on *The Wizard of Oz*, since we were in Kansas. The theme included the video of the movie on two large screens and sound clips throughout the evening. Everything was topnotch. Our sponsors included *Ektelon*, the *IRT Pro Tour, Lamar Donuts, Marriott Hotels, Overland Park Athletic Club, OneShot, Liberty Fruit, Miller Brewing Company,* and the *Overland Park Visitors Bureau.* We thank them once again, and look forward to *Ektelon* and others sponsoring our March 2008 tournament, as well.

Tournament Thoughts

Hi to all of you, I would like to have you think about our tournaments.

The USAR national organization has changed two major tournaments for the coming season. The first is the *National Doubles*. The USAR has decided to move this one to February, which will put it within three weeks of our March tournament. This raises two questions for us. First, will we need to move the March tourney to April or should we leave it as it is now played in March? For now, the board has decided to leave it in March. Second, will the *National Doubles* move impact the *Women's Senior Master Tournament*?

The *NMRA* board is considering having a third tournament during the year. This third one would be run only offering doubles or as a regular tourney with the three events. The other thing that we could also do is incorporate a *Classic Racquetball* tour in with this third tourney. In order to do this, we would offer a special division for the 40-year-olds at this event. This is because the Classic tour starts with the 40s. This tour is run like a pro event, except that there is no prize money involved, and only four *Senior Pros* (retired from the IRT-Tour) come to the event. The 40-year-olds would have to play into the pro division. The three major things that would come out of this are:

- 1. One of our members would have a chance to play against the pros if they so desire.
- 2. The pros would do free clinics or appearances for the junior programs in the area where we hold the tournament. And, the pros would help us make a money contribution to the state junior program.
- 3. More visibility will be generated for our sport and for the *Masters* organization in particular.

All of these add up to a win-win for us and racquetball. This is something I would like every member to think about and let us (the board) know what you feel we should do. If you like the idea of a third tournament as a doubles or as a regular tourney, give us that feedback.

Not for Ladies Only

Our next tournament in Utah in March will be telling as far as participation by ladies goes. The *National Doubles* for 2008 will be in February, and, with the *Women's Senior/Master tournament* in Kansas City in January,

some ladies will not (or cannot) travel quite that often for major tournaments. For you singles-only ladies who won't be going to *National Doubles*, I urge you to arrange your trip to Utah now, and get all of your friends on board to travel with you. Arrange an extra day of skiing with them, too, as long as you are so close to the world-class ski resorts near *Park City*. For the rest of you, we hope you can squeeze in one more big tournament before spring, and we are working very hard as board members to make sure you have a fantastic tournament.

If you have never played in the *Women's Senior/Masters tournament* before, we strongly encourage you to try it. It is the same round-robin/self-refereed format as our *NMRA* tournaments, but only for women, and only singles. No doubles events are offered. This tournament even offers lower-skill divisions (55B/C, as an example) and, in the past, they have been the most popular divisions, with several round-robin flights necessary to accommodate all of the players. You must be at least 35 years old to play in this event and you will find top-level competition in any division you enter. Again, I encourage you to **BRING YOUR LADY FRIENDS** and make a special week of it. This year, the tournament is in Kansas City, Kansas, and the *La Quinta Hotel* is within walking distance of the main club. Try it once, and you'll want to come back year after year.

Racquetball Shoes Going to a Museum

Some of you know that I have used a single pair of shoes for every racquetball game that I have played since I was at the *University of Illinois* in 1974 -- so 33 years. (Yes, I have often run them through the washing machine to clean and deodorize them.)

I recently replaced the shoes, and my son Matt and I were reflecting on how unbelievable it was that the shoes had lasted so long. I suggested to him that the company was probably long since out of business, as I didn't recognize the name *Bata.* I got on the computer, searched the internet, and readily found out that I was wrong—the international company is headquartered in Switzerland and has a very interesting and well-documented history, particularly during the World War II era. It turns out that the *Bata* shoe museum in Toronto is the largest shoe museum in the world. They have tours, school field trips, and quite a collection from around the world, including from royalty. Museum information: http://www.batashoemuseum.ca/collectindex.html

I contacted the Curator of the Museum, told her about my shoes, the estimated number of games played over the 33 years (unfortunately quantity, not quality), sent pictures of the shoes, told her that I used them when my Dad, Matt, and I all played in the Houston National tourney this past May, etc. It seems that there are actually very few Bata brand shoes in the museum. The curator said that Bata had discontinued sports shoes many years ago and that she was not very familiar with them. Since these were actually Bata brand, the curator contacted Mrs. Bata directly. I received an email from the curator saying, "Mrs. Bata loved the racquetball shoe story. I am opening a new exhibit next week. Can you send them to us using our Fed-X account"?

If you visit the Toronto museum, look for the enduring *Bata* racquetball shoes and think

back to the era of wooden racquets, short shorts and marvel at the changes in our equipment and the sport. What a fabulous legacy.

Finding the Right Doubles Partner

Finding a doubles partner can be pretty easy, but keeping one is a little more difficult. Some players want to find a "permanent" partner, and since styles and attitudes don't always mesh, you have to decide for yourself the most important reason to play doubles.

In most cases, you can ask a tournament director to keep an eye out for someone else in the tournament who needs a partner, and match you up. If you have played doubles a lot with other partners, a short conversation with your new partner before you start should help you get in synch. During that tournament, you can decide whether or not you want to play with that player again in the future. Of course, make sure you get his/her phone number and email address, if you plan to ask him/her to play.

To have players want to play doubles with you, though, you might want a longer conversation. Some of the considerations are:

Skill Level – It's not fair to ask a C player to play Open Doubles against skilled Open Doubles teams, and it's not acceptable to have higher-level players enter a lower division. Pair up with someone who plays doubles at the same level you do.

Age Group - The National Masters organization will let you play opponents younger than yourself, but not older. If your potential doubles partner is guite a bit older, it may not be as fun for him/her to play in the younger division.

Doubles Style – Do you like to play the front? Shoot from the back? Keep to the forehand? Always take the backhand side? Serve lobs up the middle? Rely on the cross-court pass? Never hit a ceiling ball? Play with a left-handed person? Cling to the wall? Think about the way you like to play and let your potential partner know what shot you will probably hit when certain setups come your way or it is your turn to serve. If your style is causing your partner to be out of position, you might want to test-drive a new style or a new partner.

Match Attitude – Do you believe in drilling five times a week? Winning at all costs? Arguing every call? Taking your partner's shots? Not holding up? Accusing your opponents of cheating? There is a chance that you might not be the right doubles partner for anyone. Most players I know want to play great racquetball against skilled players with cheerful (and sometimes intense) attitudes. If you can't find anyone to play doubles with you or against you, it's possible you could need an attitude adjustment.

Communication - Even if your style and attitude are perfect matches, you may still not be the perfect doubles partner until you define your communication style. Every match has lots of shots that can be effectively taken by either partner. Signals or verbal calls between partners will keep you from letting a ball drop, cracking racquet frames as you both hit a shot, or (the worst) both running to the same shot and letting the other team easily pass your uncovered court. I was taught to yell "Me" or "You" to let my partner know if I was or was NOT going to try for a shot, but there are other great ways to work with your partner, too. If your partner won't communicate, find one who will.

Longevity – There are some of us who enjoy playing with different people almost all of the time, but the security of having a go-to partner can be exactly what makes you happiest. After you



find someone to match your level, style, attitude and communication approach, ask that person if he/she is interested in playing most tournaments with you. If you are playing more tournaments than your partner, make sure they don't mind your picking up an occasional temporary partner for a weekend.

I hope to see you on the doubles court this year-as your partner and as your opponent.


The tournament hotel will be the same hotel as before, but it is now called the Brookfield Suites. The rate is still not final, but it will be under \$100 per night.
