and sent out. I have a lot of guilt about that, but I'm working hard to make up for it. Forgive me.

One of my new projects has been to livestream a lot of NMRA matches for everyone to enjoy. I was talked into considering livestreaming some NMRA matches by **Tim Baghurst** of the IRF. Tim has many other amazing qualifications, but as we were talking one day, he mentioned that the IRF had thousands of visits to their Facebook page and website based on the livestreaming of matches—new content kept people coming back. I explained that we were just some 40+ players playing racquetball—not the pros and not representing our country in international competition. But our players know a lot of people and racquetball people support racquetball people. He convinced me to find someone to help me livestream, starting in San Antonio. Tim was busy so I found a great volunteer to do our San Antonio Sunday matches—**Jeffrey Thompson** from Austin. Crazy as it is, we got

about 25,000 views of those matches!! People were interested in our matches. Amazing.

Our next NMRA event was coming up quickly, and I asked Jeffrey Thompson to teach me how to livestream using an extra iPad. I tried a few tests before we got to Chicago, and made a few changes. People were tuning in live (a little) and watching my test livestreams. Once we got to Chicago, it was pretty easy. I had some volunteer guest commentators to keep viewers up-to-date on the score and people playing.

Again in 2019, the committee of *NMRA Hall of Fame* voters chose several inductees for our prestigious *Hall of Fame*. Two of the newly-elected inductees had their ceremonies at the July *NMRA* tournament banquet in Chicago. They were:

Bill Baker

of *Rancho Palos Verdes, California*. Bill

is currently on the *NMRA Board of Directors* and has many medals that made him eligible for induction. Bill's

wife, Pearl, created an amazing video of slides and video of Bill's work career and his racquetball career. Congratulations to Bill, and Pearl for her great video show!



Mike Grisz of *Alexandria, Virginia* (previously *Dallas, Texas*). Mike is a long-time *NMRA* player and has been on the *Board of Directors* for about three years. Mike met his wife, Karen, at an *NMRA* event a few years ago and Karen did a

In addition to the recent inductees that night, we posthumously inducted another player formally. **Phil Dziuk** from *Champaign, Illinois*, had been voted into the *Hall of Fame* a few years ago and we waited for John O'Donnell (Hall of Fame member and also from *Champaign, Illinois*) to tell us all about Phil from the old days of the *NMRA*. Voting: The voting committee is currently comprised of about 30 *NMRA* members who are willing to review the candidates. Candidates are presented based on their performance and medal count; in addition, the *Board of Directors* is invited to nominate a candidate based on contribution, and medal count is not a factor for that nominee. Candidates must get a certain percentage of all votes to be inducted.

Tournament Check-In Player Meet-and-Greet	Thursday, December 5, 2019, 5 pm to 8 pm, at Recreation ATL Complimentary reception with beverages and hors d'oeuvres. Pick up tournament souvenir, play schedules, etc. and socialize. Identical Player Meetings about 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm to review procedures and answer questions It is STRONGLY recommended for NMRA first-timers but everyone is invited.
Play Begins / Ends	Starts at 8 am every day. Ends by 10 pm Friday. Ends around 5 pm Saturday and Sunday. Every division plays every day (Friday through Sunday). Please show consideration for all players and remember that we play every bracket every day of the event. Schedule your travel arrangements accordingly. Sign-in is required at the club.
Practice Courts	A few courts will be available free of charge December 5, 2019 for practice, before registration begins.
Tournament Ball	<i>Penn Pro Green</i> is the official ball of the NMRA.
Tournament Scoring	All round robins, self-refereed matches. Every division will play two games to 15. Large "pool play" divisions will have Saturday playoff matches. Playoff format will be two games to 15, tiebreaker to 11 if needed. Bonus points are awarded for winning games (2 per game) and the match (4). Ties will split the extra four match points. Points are automatically calculated by the R2sports tournament software. When any team or player must forfeit, average scores will be used to determine final results of the division or pool. If a forfeit occurs during a match, the opposing team or player will be awarded points required to finish the match. USAR amateur rules will be used.
Eligibility	USAR-sanctioned; Current USAR membership is required to participate. Your membership must be valid through the last day of the tournament. Entries will not be accepted without payment for USAR membership. USAR membership is available at www.usra.org . NMRA membership is required for all EXCEPT players who are playing in their FIRST NMRA event. Special recognition and gift for first-time players and new NMRA members.
Tournament Awards	NMRA medals will be awarded to First through Fourth place winners for each age division, no matter how many players are signed up for each division. Combined divisions will be awarded medals based on separate age divisions. You must complete all matches in a division to be awarded the medal.
Morning Hospitality	Breakfast is available at the hotel for hotel guests. Light fruit and drinks available at the Recreation ATL Club.
Lunch	Lunch is served at the Recreation ATL Club from about noon to 2 pm; you may need to present your tournament pass or bag tag.

LPRT Scoring Change

For the upcoming 2019/2020 season, the LPRT women's pro tour decided to change their match and game format scoring to match most of the amateur competitions. The format will be two games to 15 points, with a tiebreaker to 11 if necessary. Win by one point. The format will very closely match international competition format. Many of the ladies play these IRF events, representing their countries. It should be an interesting season.

Other Rules News

USA Racquetball Rules Commissioner Otto Dittrich has recently reviewed all of the racquetball rules and various organizations' rule variants, to make sure everything is set for the rulebook printing coming up in the next few months. The NMRA rules are similar to regular USAR rules, with a few obvious exceptions. We play all round robins, with extra points for games and matches, and the tournament winner is determined by points (not matches or games won or points scored against, etc.). We use the USAR forfeit procedure when a player pulls out of a division—all of his/her matches are deleted as if they were never played. 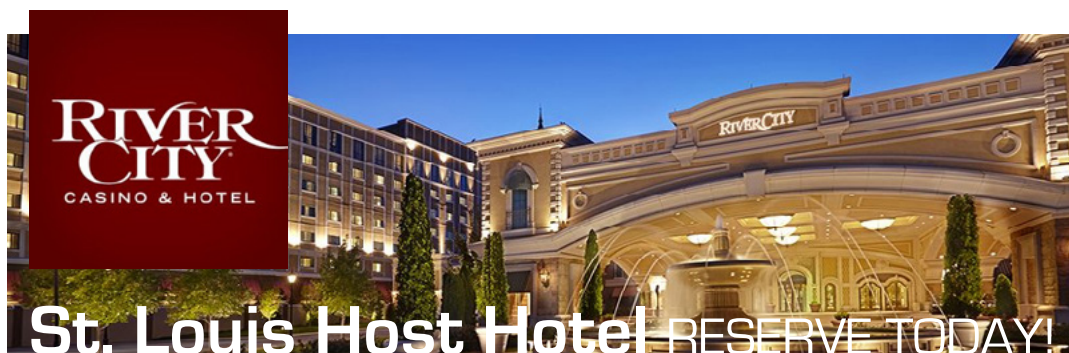

Carl Buschner,

Carl Bushner was a World War II and Korea veteran, a university professor, coach, racquetball player. Married 66 years, he died August 8, 2018 at the age of 90.

From his obituary: Carl was passionate about racquetball! He taught countless young people how to play, arranged tournaments to promote the sport including senior games, officiated, and was nationally ranked himself, even rising to #1 in the 80+ age group. Carl made friends everywhere he went, from his rye bread bakery to his bank, hardware store and pharmacies. His courage, tuneful whistle and positive outlook enriched his family life. His mother had advised him to leave everywhere he went better than he found it and he lived true to her advice.

From David Maitland December 28, 2018: When I read the *Remembrances* in the latest *RacquetRacket* I was reminded that I hadn't heard from **Carl Buschner** for a while. *Google* informed me he died in August 2018. Carl only played in a few *NMRA* tournaments. He began playing in the '60s and was a long-time contributor to *Racquetball*. Ten years ago he was ranked #1 in 80 + by *USAR*. Many older players will miss the birthday cards he sent every year. He ran *New England Masters* tournaments as well as the *Massachusetts Senior Games*. Carl had health problems the last three or four years and was unable to play or do the daily workouts that had always been part of his life. My words do not do him justice. I will miss him.

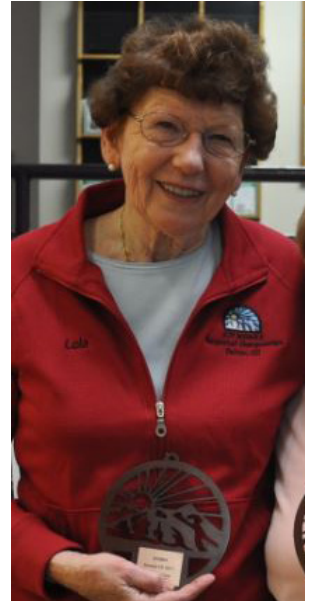


Ivan Bruner, Madison, WI

I recently heard about the modified-tennis game, Pickleball, for the first time from a seatmate on a plane. It does seem like a healthy—and addictive—game.

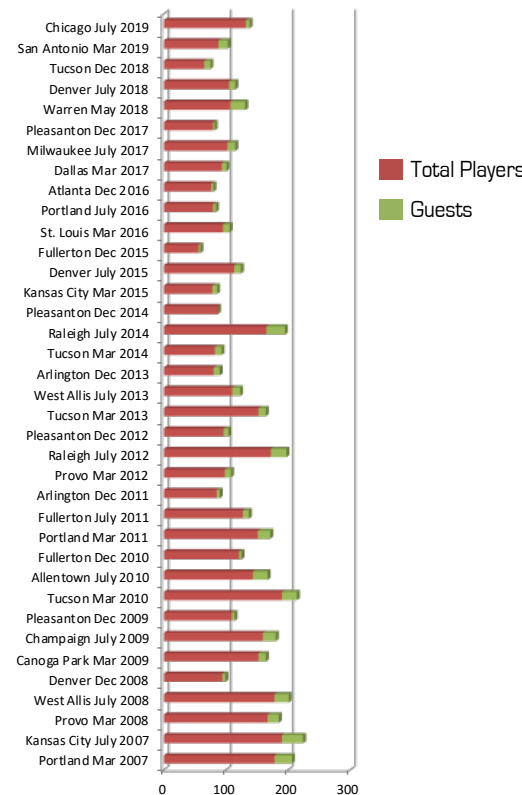
I'm not sure why you would share your reasonable concerns regarding your co-worker's performance at work with me rather than with him.

His supervisor should speak with him, be frank about his job performance, and suggest strongly that his job will be in jeopardy if he doesn't step up.

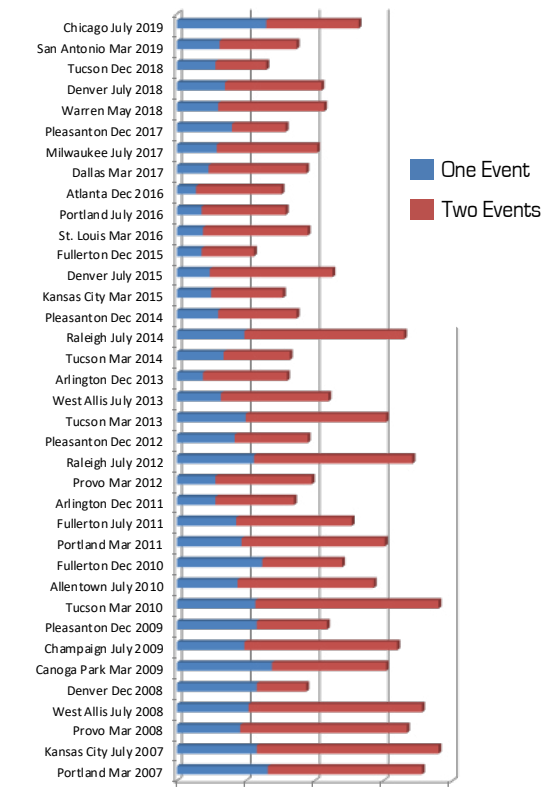

NMRA 2019 Tournament Statistics since 2007

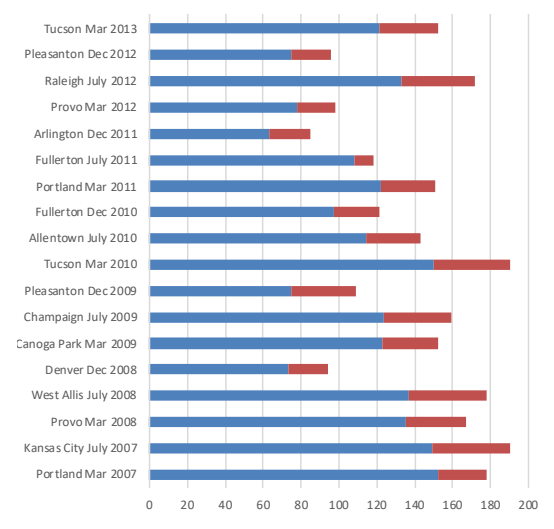
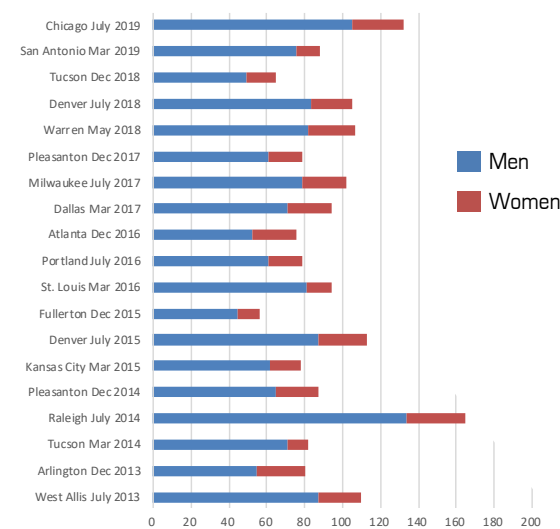
NMRA Total Tournament Participants and Guests
